ANNEXURE II

FORMS TO BE FILLED AND DOCUMENTS TO BE ATTACHED WITH THE ADMISSION FORM

- a. Fill a separate **Admission Form** (available from the College office) and affix your recent passport size photograph at specified place.
- b. Fill University Enrolment Form (available from the College office).
- c. Fill form for Identity Card (available from the College office) and affix your recent passport size photograph at specified place.

Self attested photocopy of following documents -: (d) to (k):

- d. Marks Sheet of passing Class XII examination (Qualifying examination).
- e. Certificate of Date of Birth (High School Certificate – Class X).
- f. Character Certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
- g. Provisional Certificate of passing the Qualifying Examination (Class XII) from the institution last attended.
- h. Migration Certificate, in case the student is from a Board/University other than Delhi.
- i. Certificate from the Head of the School stating that the candidate has passed Hindi language upto class VIII in case candidate has not studied Hindi language in class X or XII. This certificate would be required for exemption from Compulsory Test in Hindi (CTH). Candidates (except foreign nationals) who have not studied Hindi at all or upto a standard lower than class VIII would be required to pass CTH conducted by the University of Delhi at later stage in current year.
- j. Caste/Category certificate (if admitted under any reserved category). The caste/category certificate should be issued in the name of the candidate concerned. The certificate of OBC candidates must mention non-creamy layer status of the candidate and the caste must be included in the Central List for OBC's. Income certificate of parents for the financial year 2013-14 would be required for justifying non-creamy layer status of candidate in case OBC certificate is dated earlier than June 2013.
- k. Relevant sports certificates, in case candidate is admitted under Sports Quota.
- l. Admission Order/Slip from the University in case candidate seeking admission under SC/ST/Persons with Disability/Armed Forces/Foreign/Kashmiri Migrant categories.
- m. **All certificates/documents in original as mentioned above.**

In addition to above each candidate would be required to submit Affidavits in a prescribed format on stamp paper duly signed by the student and parent. (The format of affidavits will be provided by the college).

(Fee payable at the time of admission is Rs. 15,000/- in cash only.)

To elucidate, if a candidate in category E has 97% marks, his/her marks are equivalent to 95% marks in Category A.
