3. What is ornamental

## B. Centre for Economic History

Given the immense importance of the subject matter of the India's economic thoughts, philosophy, wisdom, history and tradition, and the relative lack of awareness and acknowledgement of the same, Shri Ram College of Commerce aspires to have a leadership role in creating and sustaining awareness, appreciation and discussions on the rich glory of India's diverse Economic History, Wisdom and Tradition. With this overarching vision, the Shri Ram College of Commerce established a Centre for Indian Economic History (CIEH, SRCC) towards developing and disseminating knowledge, research and related competencies on Economic History, Economic Thoughts and Economic Wisdoms of India. The CIEH, SRCC undertakes events and activities to reinvigorate research, discussion and discourse in Indian Economic History and Ancient Indian Economic Wisdom.

The CIEH, SRCC is currently undertaking the following projects:

- Three Projects on the theme of *"Development and Dissemination of Knowledge, Research and Competencies on Economic History, Wisdom and Economic Thought of Ancient India"* by the Ministry of Culture, Government of India under the *Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav*. Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Trust Foundation (Kalam Centre) is the knowledge partner of the CIEH for the projects.
- A Project on the theme of *"Developing and Disseminating Knowledge, Research and Competencies on Historical Perspective of Consumer Protection in India"* under the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Government of India.

### Activities Undertaken:

The Centre for Indian Economic History (CIEH) at Shri Ram College of Commerce organized a Two-Day Workshop on *"Developing Knowledge, Research and Competencies on Economic History and Economic Thoughts of India: Ancient Perspectives"* on July 14-15, 2023 in online mode. - Ms. Ojasvi Goyal Senior Consultant, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India.

Over 150 participants attended the Two-Day Workshop across India. Shri Govind Mohan, Secretary, Ministry of Culture, Government of India graced the Workshop as the Chief Guest for the Valedictory.







Those who analysed the problem statement from different perspectives proved to be successful at the competition. Witnessing 900+ registrations, Hack-D-Case was a challenging one to hack. Another interesting event was 'Kaun Banega Mathemagician' which was an exclusive competition for all the mathophiles along the lines of the famous game show "Kaun Banega Crorepati". Decipher- The Treasure Hunt consisted of mind-boggling riddles and puzzles that challenged the participants' problem-solving skills. The participants had to search around the campus trying to beat each other in the race against time and wit.

Enigma 2023, which is an annual fest conducted by the Computers and Mathematics Society, is one of the flagship events was conducted on the 18th, 19th and 20th of April. The fest witnessed unique and interesting events like 'Challenge Accepted', which encompassed a four-round multifaceted technological simulation featuring thought-provoking questions. This event achieved resounding success, attracting a noteworthy attendance of over 650 participants from esteemed institutions and prizes worth 40k. 'Mad Over Maths' was a three-round mathematics-based competition aimed to assess participants' mathematical proficiency and problem-solving acumen.

The society has further engagements through events like the Social Outreach

Programme, conducted in collaboration with the Maths Department of the college on 5th August 2022 for 20 students of Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) School. The main aim of the workshop was to educate the students about basic maths tricks and make them familiar with concepts like Abacus. The Campus Ambassador Programme Adjoint engaged high school and undergraduate students in a Campus Ambassador Programme. It lasted for 2 months and allowed the participants to display their intellect, creativity, and exuberance as well as a chance to participate in enriching research discussions and fun activities. The Fellowship Programme Compact- The Fellowship Programme was organized under Project Computer Literacy from October'22 - November'22.

## **DEBATING SOCIETY**

The Debating Society, SRCC is a pioneer in debate, discourse, and deliberation on matters of national and international significance. We have fostered some of the best minds in the nation in the sectors of industry, politics, film, and academia including the likes of Late Shri Arun Jaitley (Former Finance Minister, Government of India), Shri Navtej Sarna (Former Spokesperson, Ministry of External Affairs), Mr. Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra (Eminent Film Director) among many other notable members. student debate via parliamentary debating events and workshops.

As a cultural hub in Delhi University, our society organized two flagship Debating Tournaments in 2022-23 namely 'Shri Ram Pre-Asian British Parliamentary Debate' and the 17th edition of 'Shri Ram Debating Festival' across two semesters annually. This Debating Festival includes events such as 'Synergy- The Group

Discussion', 'Renegade-The Annual School's Turn coat Debate' and '3v3 The Legacy Debate'.

Alongside this, we also organized 'Rahat' - the collaborative fundraiser parliamentary debate of SRCC, SBS, Sri Venkateshwara College, and Hindu College for raising awareness about social causes. Thus, by witnessing participation from 4+ countries, we prepare promising and inquisitive minds to talk about societal issues that matter through these events. Additionally, with a legacy of inculcating the spirit of innovative thinking, problem-solving and analytical thinking, we also host 'Crossfire: The Annual Schools' Debate of Shri Ram College of Commerce' and India's Largest Debating Workshop - the Shri Ram Debating Workshop, catering to around 350+ school students across the country. To uphold the training of its members, the society also maintains a regular flow of activities around the year including mock debates (both intra-society and with the societies of other colleges) to ensure as much practice as possible.

Throughout the year, our members also represent the college in various National and International Tournaments, wherein they achieve laurels in prominent tournaments such as Sydney Australasian Women's Debating Championship, World Universities Debating Championship-Belgrade, Pakistan Debate Open, IIM Ahmedabad- Red Bricks Submit, NLU Odisha, NALSAR Inter-Varsity, Thailand Debate Open, among many others. This year, the society also helped in organizing SRCC's first ever debate in the loving memory of its alumni Late Shri Arun Jaitley as part of DU's centenary celebrations and Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava. The Memorial Debate was graced with the presence of the Hon'ble Vice President of India- Shri Jagdeep Dhankar as the Guest of Honour.

## **DRAMATICS SOCIETY**

The Street Production 2022-23 "Aur Kitna Intezaar" challenges misconceptions surrounding organ donation by debunking myths and addressing superstitions related to organ donation. The Stage Production 2022-23 "Laal Roshni" depicts the difficult world of prostitution in 1980s. It portrays the struggles these women face, highlighting the abuse of power, which pervades the industry. "Laal Dupatta", a 2022-23 stage playlet portrays the physical and mental tormenting of a young girl who is affected by AIDS, depicting how societal pressure forces someone to self-harm highlighting the dire need of an inclusive society. The Mime Production 2022-23, inspired by the infamous Nirbhaya case, revolved around the repeated horrendous acts of crime against women and the never-ending circle of life. The production bagged laurels for the college by getting a podium finish twice, first at Hansraj College (third position), then at Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur (second position).

The other highlight even of the society was Interdram, that is one of a kind event in the entire DCTC. It witnessed participation from 15+ colleges of Dramatics Societies of University of Delhi and over 500+ participants.

Histrionica 2023 was the two-day Annual Flagship event of the Dramatics Society and is the largest non-competitive performing Arts Festival in the University of Delhi. Histrionica 2023 marked the 20th edition of the annual flagship and performing arts fest of 'The Dramatics Society,' SRCC on April 18-19, 2023. The event was a huge success witnessing a collaboration with 25+ sponsors, 13+ Bollywood actors and movie artists, 5+ media partners and garnering a footfall of

20k+ and 1k+ participation with a reach of 14.06M+ and organic impressions of 17.9M+ across all social media platforms. The event was graced by the presence of college alumnus Gulshan Grover along with celebrities like Sanya Malhotra, Harsh Beniwal, Vikram, Trisha Krishnan, Aishwarya Lekshmi, Sobhita Dhulipala, Karthi Sivakumar, Shantanu Maheshwari, Tanya Maniktala, Yashpal Sharma, Moses Koul and Chayan Chopra.

In this academic session, the Dramatics society organized events like Dramflix where Rajkumar Rao, Huma Qureshi, Radhika Apte and Vasan Bala were invited for a promotion and interview. Siddhart Mahlotra too was part of another similar promotion and interactive session with the audience. Another event that emerged as a highlight was an interactive Speaker Session with Prakhar Gupta, host of the PG Radio podcast.

## **ENACTUS**

Enactus SRCC is a part of the global non-profit organization, which was started in 2007. At Enactus, we are committed to making the world a better place by training the next generation of entrepreneurs and social innovators. We undertake community outreach initiatives by developing social enterprise projects that solve social problems, and positively touch the lives of those in need.

In the current academic session, the society initiated a project 'ASBAH' that provides clean drinking water to underprivileged communities plagued by the lack of accessibility or affordability for drinking water. The society collaborated with Mannat, an NGO and distributed 500+ ration kits. Through Project 'Asbah' a vast and well-established network of 18 plants and 6 states in India had been established. The

project proudly stands as a self-sustainable system, growing without external assistance. The project received BCG Grant worth INR 1 Lakh to expand into West Bengal. The project has created an impact by Rs. 5.5 Crore savings on water expenditure. The project was adjudged as the winner of the Cisco Employees' Choice Award.

Project 'Amal' is another significant initiative undertaken by Enactus that aims at minimizing the catastrophic impact of stubble burning by converting them into eco-friendly biomass Briquettes. The project has won Race for Better India under the climate action category and has also collaborated with PRESPL for enhanced exposure to the industry.

Project 'Leher' is yet another project that aims at developing end-to-end collection and upcycling methods that turn cigarette wastes into useful products. It was adjudged as the Runners Up of 1 race 4 Ocean out of 92 teams at the Enactus World Cup 2022.

Project 'Virasat' aims to revive India's dying Craft forms. We are currently working towards the Usta Art of Bikanern and gaura work of Gaurahari. The project was Runners-up in November 2022 at the Accenture Innovation Challenge, winning a cash Prize worth Rs. 2,25,000. It has constantly been involved in setting up of Centres of Excellence across the country.

## **ECONOMICS SOCIETY**

The society organises mega events like Shri Ram Economics Summit in 2023, which garnered an impressive reach with over 200+ institutions across 3+ countries. Prominent personalities from various sectors enriched the event. The summit along with the society's magnum opus of research symposium wisely, Shri

Ram Research Festival 2022 was aimed at promoting unique and authentic research, encouraging young researchers in paper presentation and data analysis. The event garnered significant traction with over 1,20,000 views, 2400 registrations, and participation from 600 institutes across 4 sessions.

The society has academic initiatives like National Economics Olympiad; an online pan-India Economics Olympiad for high school students (Classes 11 & 12) which saw significant participation, with 6500+ registrations from 1200+ schools across 400+ cities and 24+ states. Internships were offered to 80+ participants, and the event featured 10+ knowledge sessions in collaboration with two partners.

The society has further engagements with school students through events like Writing Mentorship Programme which is a two-week academic writing workshop for high school students (Classes XI and XII), Editors-in-Chief and Research & Policy Directors led sessions highlighting rigorous research and academic writing.

'Discourse: An Archive of Ideas' titled lecture series is regularly hosted with members of the academia, providing a platform for discussion on issues of general interest. Esteemed speakers such as Mr Azhar Iqbal, Mr Shishir Prasad discussed millennial self-assertion, India's startup ecosystem, and the global economic landscape.

The society has a jubilant publication culture wherein it comes up with myriad journals, articles, newsletters and the like. Prominent ones in its armour include the Artha: An Economics Journal 2023 with a total of 23 contributors, hailing from prominent institutions such as UNDP, ISI, DSE, Ashoka University, Uranium Corporation of India, American University, and Novartis, published 23 articles.

Among these, 8 were internal contributions, and 15 were external. The publication was launched with the esteemed presence of K.V. Subramanian, the 17th Chief Economic Advisor to the Government of India, currently serving as India's Executive Director at the IMF coupled with Ceteris Paribus: SRCC's Digital Publication featuring over 90 articles with contributions from external expert Dr. Annavajhula J.C. Bose.

## **CENTER FOR GREEN INITIATIVES**

The workshops were organized on myriad topics from "Science of Meditation" in

close association with a non-profit organization 'Heartfulness' with the aim to inculcate habits of meditation, yoga and spirituality to focusing on corporate skills in collaboration with Bangalore University and Faculty Development Programmes on Effective use of Hindi in different aspects of teaching by the college faculty.

Besides the workshops, the cell also takes pride as organizers of International Conference on New Horizons in Commerce, Finance & Economics in collaboration with Chinmaya Vishwa Vidyapeeth (Ernakulam, Kerala). The conference aimed at providing an interdisciplinary forum to practitioners, academicians, and research scholars in the domain of Commerce, Management and Economics. ## 4. WB Seminar on India's Position in a Changing Global Economy

## 7. Indo-Dutch Outgoing Exchange Programme

Delegates including Dr. Mallika Kumar (Faculty Coordinator) embarked on a weeklong tour from 12 to 16 June 2023 for the Intensive International Programme on the theme 'Global Management Game' at the Utrecht Business School, HU University of Applied Sciences, Netherlands. In this programme, the visiting guests collaborated with the



students of HU University of Applied Sciences, playing a business management simulation game in teams. In the weeklong event, students interacted with each other, exchanged culture and were immersed in the process of business decision-making. The activities, in brief, contained a business simulation game, training on sales pitch, a guest lecture, an inter-cultural workshop, and a social programme, including a dinner and cultural visit. Besides the international experience, it also focused on experiential learning that has been seen as an effective learning strategy.

### **8. SRCC OIP - Y20 Yuva Manthan Model G20 Summit**

Y20 Yuva Manthan Model G20 was held on September 1, 2023. It was a one-day event with the theme 'Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction', which saw students from SRCC take up roles as sherpas from all G20 countries and debate the developmental and socio-political challenges faced by the member countries and the world. The competition started with contestants expressing concerns for the theme which was followed by voting for the top 7 ideas as given by participants for transitioning to sustainable living, mitigating disaster risks, acceleration of green energy and much more. In an effort to expand the realm of consultancy beyond conventional confines, this year saw SRCRC's new domain in the form of Anvesh - The Training Centre. SRCRC is inspired by the opportunity to serve a larger purpose. This abiding vision has spurred innovation, creativity and vitality to ensure substantial personal growth of each member.

The Training Center will serve the corporate social responsibility of the society while offering invaluable aid to students. It will include research sessions including data collection methods and

data analysis sessions, interview guidance, and some pilot projects in which the trainees will be able to show their candidature by working on real-world live projects. The Training Center aims to bridge the gap between theoretical education and practical application thereby empowering students with the imperative proficiencies to excel in consultancy and research fields. **Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman**  
*Union Minister of Finance  
and Corporate Affairs  
Government of India*

Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman was born on August 18, 1959 in Madurai, Tamil Nadu to Smt. K. Savitri and Shri K. Sitharaman. She completed her bachelors from Seethalakshmi Ramaswamy College in Trichirapalli and headed to the prestigious JawaharLal Nehru University to pursue her masters in Economics. After submitting her doctoral thesis on Indo-European Textile Trade, she moved to London and worked as the Senior Manager (Research & Analysis) in Price Waterhouse, London. During her stay in London she also worked briefly for BBC World Services. Post her return to India, she was keen on working towards institutionalizing Policy Analysis in India and therefore established Centre for Public Policy Studies in Hyderabad in 1992. In 1997, She established Pranava, a school in Hyderabad that won the British Council's International School Award, 2007-2010 for its unconventional approach to education that prioritized giving shape to a child's inherent talent over the conventional learn and rote system.

From 2003-2005, she served as a member of the National Commission for Women and in 2008, she was invited to become a member of the BJP's National Executive and since then she has been actively involved in drafting almost all of party's Economic and Political Resolutions. In 2010, Smt. Sitharaman was appointed as the National spokesperson of the party and was widely respected for her well researched and graceful articulation of the party's stand.

During the Gujarat Assembly Elections, 2012, Smt. Sitharaman worked directly under the leadership of Shri Narendra Modi wherein she was given the responsibility of organizing BJP's Media Campaign for the elections. After the historic victory of BJP in General Elections , 2014, she was inducted into the Council of Ministers and she held the charge of Minister of State (Independent charge) for Commerce & Industry.

In May 2016, she was one of the twelve candidates nominated by the BJP to contest the Rajya Sabha elections due on 11 June 2016. She successfully contested her seat from Karnataka. On September 3, 2017, she became the first full-time woman Defence Minister of India. After the general elections of 2019, Nirmala Sitharaman has been given the responsibility of the Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister of India.
