“Education is the key which is going to unlock the door to our greatness....”

Lala Shri Ram, the enigmatic visionary behind the institution, was born on April 27, 1884. The first son of Madan Mohan Lal and Chando Devi, Lala Shri Ram completed his education in Delhi. In 1909, the 25 years old Lala Shri Ram joined DCM.

He possessed an analytical mind, an infinite capacity for work, and a knack for human relations. During his life, Lala Shri Ram's main emphasis was on vocational, technical and women's education. As far back in 1920, he had decided to conduct the first experiment in vocation-oriented education by founding the Commercial Education Trust. The first school taken over by Commercial Education Trust was the Commercial High School. The Commercial High School was raised in 1926 to the standard of an Intermediate College, in 1930 to a degree college and in 1934 to a post-graduate College.

In 1942, Lala Shri Ram became the Chairman of the Governing Body of the College. By the year 1948, although comparatively young among the colleges of Delhi University, the Commercial College had the maximum enrolment possible under the University rules. The College offered B.A. Pass course and the B.A. Honours course in Commerce and M.A. courses in Economics and Commerce. Until 1949, the College was located at 8, Darya Ganj, New Delhi. In 1949, it was proposed to rename the College as “Shri Ram College of Commerce”. In 1950, the proposal to shift the College to the University Enclave was accepted and implemented.

Sir/Madam,

The following procedure shall be followed for conduct of Internal Assessment, Practical, Viva-Voce, Projects, Oral (Moot courts), Apprenticeship, Internship, Field Work which are required for completion before the conduct of End Term Theory Examinations.

- **Internal Assessment:** Instead of the three existing components of Internal Assessment, viz., Class Tests, Tutorial Test and Attendance, only one component i.e. internal assignments will be carried out for the current semester. Internal assessment of the students should also be carried out using IT tools. Teacher should give the assignment to the students in prescribed format via e-mail. The student should submit the solved assignment to the teacher via e-mail in a defined time. The top of the Assignment Sheet must have Program name, Semester, Title of Paper and Name of the Student. After evaluation, respective teacher will submit the result of the same to the o/o the principal of the college and to the o/o the Head of the Department in the case of PostGraduation. Those who have already completed the process of internal assessment in the continuous form or as per existing rule in this regard are required to submit the same to the o/o the principal of the respective college. Attendance component in IA shall be considered full for the lockdown period and benefit should be granted to all students while calculating IA for each paper as per the distribution of marks.
- **Examination of Practical Courses:** The evaluation of Practical Examination, wherever applicable, will be in the 100% continuous evaluation mode. For Laboratory paper, teacher should give the assignment based on Experiments already performed through e-mail to the students. The student should submit the solved assignment to the teacher via e-mail in a stipulated time period. The name of Program, Semester, title of practical paper and name of the student should be mentioned at the top of the answer sheet by the student before submission.
- **Practical and Viva voce, Oral (Moot courts) Examinations:** For final and Intermediate semester/Term/Year students of all professional and technical programs, all such practical and viva voce as part of the requirements of the completion of degrees for final semester /Term/Year students should be conducted through Skype or other meeting apps.

ACTION PLAN

1. The Poster and Video Contest on the theme “Together Against corruption!” will be held at pan India level.

2. Goals and objectives of the Contest

The goals of the Contest are:

- to encourage the young people to participate in corruption prevention,
- to develop and use social advertising against corruption,
- to foster interaction between the society and prosecution authorities and other public authorities in anti-corruption education of the population.

The objectives of the Contest include:

- anti-corruption education of population;
- developing a zero tolerance within society for any manifestations of corruption;
- strengthening of trust in public authorities, including prosecution authorities, developing a positive perception of their work;
- demonstration of the openness to the civil society of the prosecution authorities and other anti-corruption public authorities and their focus on joint anti-corruption activities;
- drawing public attention to anti-corruption issues, as well as to the role of the prosecution authorities and other public authorities engaged in this area, as well as to the results of this work.

3. Restrictive requirements of the Contest

Contest works should not contain:

- texts, plots, actions of stage persons and characters that are contrary to the laws of the Interstate Anti-Corruption Council and the BRICS countries;
- obscene words (abusive language), words and phrases degrading human dignity, strong expressions and slang, embedded advertising, demonstration of smoking, firearms and cold weapons, explosives, the process of making explosive devices, the use of alcohol and drugs, other psychotropic substances;
- showing actual addresses and telephone numbers, information on religious movements, including religious symbols, names and references to existing brands of goods, trademarks, service marks, individuals and legal entities;
- images of fascist paraphernalia (swastika), scenes of violence, any kind of discrimination, vandalism, blood, reflecting the bodily suffering of people and animals, sexually explicit scenes, images of naked people, and other information, degrading in any form a person or a group of people, as well as information that may cause harm to health and (or) child development and containing calls for extremist activities.

- it is not allowed to use other people's texts, videos and audio materials (plagiarism), except for citing works to the extent permitted by the copyright law.
 - In case of non-compliance with these requirements, the work will be disqualified from participation in the Contest at any stage.
4. Vigilance Study Circles Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Vizag, Hyderabad, Bangalore, Kerala and Chennai Chapters shall disseminate and coordinate the contest in association with the CVOs of Ministries/Departments, CPSEs, PSBs, PSICs and other organisations/expert groups falling in their respective regions as per the following plan:

File formats: mpeg 4, resolution not more than 1920x1080, physical size of the file up to 300 MB.

Duration: up to 120 seconds.

11. The Contest posters/videos of participants can be in official language of the States or in English. The 1st winning entry (both poster & video each) shall be submitted online to the Organizer i.e. General Prosecutor's Office of Russian Federation for onward transmission to the International Jury for Finals. The National Committee will also shortlist 10 best posters and 10 best videos, in addition to the winning entries, for submitting them to the Organizer for posting on the official website www.anticorruption.life/enfor exhibition (exposition) purpose. The National Committee shall submit all the semi-final shortlisted works to the Organizer latest by 31.10.2019.
15. The National Committee will assess the contest entries according to the following criteria: conformity to the stated theme; reasonableness and in-depth coverage of the topic; creativity, novelty of the idea and quality of work performance; accuracy and clarity of the language and style of presentation; compliance of the work with the goals, objectives and restrictive requirements of the contest.
16. The winning entries (1st, 2nd & 3rd) at National level in each category shall be awarded suitable prizes.

THE RULES
of the International Youth Contest
of Social Anti-Corruption Advertising
“Together Against Corruption!”

I. General provisions

The present Rules of the International Youth Contest of Social Anti-Corruption Advertising “Together against Corruption!” (hereinafter referred to as the Rules) define the main goals, objectives and the modalities of the Contest.

The Contest is organized by the Prosecutor General's Office of the Russian Federation. The Co-organizers are the relevant anti-corruption authorities of other Member States of the Interstate Anti-Corruption Council (Republic of Armenia, Republic of Belarus, Republic of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Republic of Tajikistan) and the BRICS countries (the Federative Republic of Brazil, Republic of India, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of South Africa).

II. Goals and objectives of the Contest

2.1. The goals of the Contest are: to encourage the young people to participate in corruption prevention, to develop and use social advertising against corruption, to foster interaction between the society and prosecution authorities and other public authorities in anti-corruption education of the population.

2.2. The objectives of the Contest include:

anti-corruption education of population;

developing a zero tolerance within society for any manifestations of corruption;

strengthening of trust in public authorities, including prosecution authorities, developing a positive perception of their work;

demonstration of the openness to the civil society of the prosecution authorities and other anti-corruption public authorities and their focus on joint anti-corruption activities;

drawing public attention to anti-corruption issues, as well as to the role of the prosecution authorities and other public authorities engaged in this area, as well as to the results of this work.

2.3. The Organizer and the Co-organizers of the Contest will be tasked with informing and notifying the target audience about the Contest, its goals and objectives, and terms and conditions.

III. Terms and conditions, Contest categories, opening and closing dates for submission of works

3.1. The Contest is open to the nationals of the Interstate Anti-Corruption Council and the BRICS countries (individual authors and creative teams, individuals and legal entities).

The authors and co-authors of Contest works (including those who submitted applications on behalf of a legal entity) should be aged from 14 to 35.

3.2. The Contest will be held in the following categories:

- "The Best Poster"
- "The Best Video"

3.3. Contest works at the semi-final stage will be accepted in the official languages of the States of the Organizer/Co-organizers of the Contest or in English.

3.4. Contest works will be accepted on the official contest website <http://anticorruption.life>, available in the Russian and English languages.

3.5. Co-organizers may independently establish a separate procedure for accepting contest works using national resources, subject to the implementation of paragraph 6.5 of Section VI of these Rules.

3.6. To take part in the Contest, an applicant must prepare a poster and/or a video on the topic "Together against Corruption!" in accordance with the goals and objectives of the Contest.

3.7. The contest is open for submission of works from 10:00 (Moscow time) on 1 June 2019 until 6:00 pm (Moscow time) on 1 October 2019.

IV. The procedure and timeframe of the Contest

The Contest will be held in 2019 in two stages:

1) **The semi-final (1 June - 31 October 2019)**

- Acceptance of Contest works (1 June - 31 October 2019).
- Voting by the National Contest Commissions for the best contest works in both categories (1 October - 31 October 2019).

The contest works which, in the view of National Contest Commissions, took the first place (finally, one poster and one video from each state-participant) will advance to the finals.

By 31 October 2019, the National Contest Commissions must submit to the Organizer for subsequent transmission to the International Jury the works of the semi-final top winners (posters and videos) with English translation (subtitles) to proceed to the Contest final.

Within the same timeline, the National Contest Commissions shall submit to the Organizer "the 10 best posters" and "the 10 best videos" with the English translation (subtitles) for their posting on the start page of website

www.anticorruption.life and using when preparing the exhibition (exposition) of the Contest works.

2) **The final (1 November - 15 November 2019)** - voting by the International Jury for the Contest works advanced to the final, selection of top winners and prize-winners in each of the categories.

V. Registration of participants, submission requirements

5.1. Check in.

5.1.1. In order to take part in the Contest, an applicant must register a personal account on the official Contest website <http://anticorruption.life>, complete the registration form and confirm his/her agreement with the Contest Rules and consent to the personal data processing.

5.1.2. Contest works that meet the technical requirements specified in paragraph 5.2 of the Rules will be electronically downloaded through a personal account on the Contest website along with completed explanatory information for each work.

5.2. Technical requirements for Contest works:

• **Category "The Best Video"**

File formats: mpeg 4, resolution not more than 1920x1080, physical size of the file up to 300 MB.

Duration: up to 120 seconds.

Sound: 16 bits, stereo.

• **Category "The Best Poster"**

File formats: JPG, resolution needed to print A3 size picture (297 x 420 mm) with correct aspect ratio and 300 dpi resolution. The physical size of a single file is up to 15 MB.

5.3. Restrictive requirements.

Contest works should not contain:

- texts, plots, actions of stage persons and characters that are contrary to the laws of the Interstate Anti-Corruption Council and the BRICS countries;
- obscene words (abusive language), words and phrases degrading human dignity, strong expressions and slang, embedded advertising, demonstration of smoking, firearms and cold weapons, explosives, the process of making explosive devices, the use of alcohol and drugs, other psychotropic substances;
- showing actual addresses and telephone numbers, information on religious movements, including religious symbols, names and references to existing brands of goods, trademarks, service marks, individuals and legal entities;
- images of fascist paraphernalia (swastika), scenes of violence, any kind of discrimination, vandalism, blood, reflecting the bodily suffering of people and animals, sexually explicit scenes, images of naked people, and other information, degrading in any form a person or a group of people, as well as information that

may cause harm to health and (or) child development and containing calls for extremist activities.

- it is not allowed to use other people's texts, videos and audio materials (plagiarism), except for citing works to the extent permitted by the copyright law.

In case of non-compliance with these requirements, the work will be disqualified from participation in the Contest at any stage.

5.4. Contest works will not be returned and will not be reviewed.

5.5. All submitted works will be assessed by the National Contest Commission of the country wherefrom the work was submitted to the Contest.

5.6. The Organizer/Co-organizers of the Contest will individually provide feedback to their countries' participants to resolve current issues.

5.7. After 31 October 2019, the works selected by the National Contest Commissions of the participating States will be available for public viewing on the official Contest website among "the 10 best posters" and "the 10 best videos".

VI. Consideration and assessment of Contest works: National Contest Commissions and the International Jury

6.1. National Contest Commission will be formed by the Organizer/Co-organizers on their own to select the works and designate the top winners of the Contest semi-final.

The semi-final procedure (the national stage of the Contest), formation of the National Contest Commissions, their activities and assessment of Contest works and the award ceremony for the top winners of the semi-finals in each State will be determined by the participating States on their own.

It is recommended that the National Contest Commission include members of the States parties' authorities tasked with combating corruption; representatives of culture and art, civil society, mass media; experts in social advertising.

6.2. The Contest works will be assessed according to the following criteria: conformity to the stated theme; reasonableness and in-depth coverage of the topic; creativity, novelty of the idea and quality of work performance; accuracy and clarity of the language and style of presentation; compliance of the work with the requirements listed in sections V and VIII of the Rules.

6.3. At the semi-final stage, National Contest Commissions in each of the nominations will determine the following places:

- Ist place – the top winner of the semi-final in the relevant category;
- IInd and IIIrd places – the prize-winners of the semi-final in the relevant category.

The Contest works which in the view of the National Contest Commission took the first place in the semi-final (finally, one poster and one video from each state-participant) will advance to the final.

6.4. The National Contest Commissions reserve right not to designate any participant as the top winner in a particular category or in all the Contest categories.

6.5. The works of semi-final top winners (posters and videos) with English translation (subtitles) will be submitted by the National Contest Commissions by e-mail **no later than 31 October 2019** to the Organizer for transmission to the International Jury of the Contest.

Within the same time limit, the National Contest Commissions will submit to the Organizer “the 10 best posters” and “the 10 best videos” with English translation (subtitles) for posting on the start page of website www.anticorruption.life and for using in preparation of the exhibition (exposition) of Contest works.

6.6. The National Contest Commission will ensure that the works of the Contest semi-final top winners, selected as “top 10”, comply with the requirements listed in sections V and VIII of the Rules.

6.7. The International Jury of the Contest will be formed by the Organizer among the representatives of each State-participant of the Contest (one candidate from each state).

6.8. The Co-organizers will provide the Organizer the information on their candidate for the International Jury of the Contest by **1 August 2019**.

6.9. At the final stage, the International Jury of the Contest will determine by a vote based on a rating scale of 1 to 10 by a simple majority of votes:

- Ist place – the top winner of the Contest in the relevant category;
- IInd and IIIrd places – the prize-winners of the Contest in the relevant category.

6.10. The members of the International Jury will vote on-line on the official website.

A member of the International Jury of a particular participating State should vote only once for each of the works advanced to the final based on a rating scale of 1 to 5.

At the same time, a member of the International Jury of the State participating in the Contest should not vote for the works of the competitors from his/her country.

Top winners (Ist place) and prize-winners (IInd and IIIrd places) of the Contest in each category will be determined based on the highest average score obtained according to the International Jury voting results.

VII. Award ceremony for top winners and prize-winners of the Contest. Reimbursement of expenses.

7.1. Top winners and prize-winners of the Contest final will be awarded honorary prizes designated by the Organizer of the Contest.

7.2. The solemn award ceremony for top winners and prize-winners of the Contest will be timed to the International Anti-Corruption Day (9 December) and will be held in December 2019, in Moscow.

The venue of this event may be changed at the discretion of the Organizer and Co-organizers.

7.3. The expenses related to the air travel of participants and accompanying persons to the solemn award ceremony will be covered by themselves or by the relevant anti-corruption authority of the State party of the Organizer and Co-organizers.

The expenses for accommodation and meals of participants and accompanying persons during their stay in Moscow will be paid by the Organizer.

7.4. The expenses (air travel, accommodation and meals) associated with a business trip of the representatives of the relevant anti-corruption authorities of the State participating in the Contest, as well as other officials' expenses related to their participation in the award ceremony, will be covered by the sending party.

VIII. Intellectual property rights

8.1. Each participant who submitted his or her work for the Contest shall guarantee that he/she is the copyright holder of the contest work and confirm that the exclusive license for the right to use the contest work has not been transferred to a third party.

8.2. If any third-party intellectual property objects were used in the work, the participant must indicate the authorship and confirm the right to use such intellectual property.

8.3. The participant will provide to the Organizer and the Co-Organizers, free of charge, a non-exclusive license (hereinafter referred to as the "License") for the right to use the works for organizing and holding the Contest, as well as for subsequent use thereof as a social advertisement, including at exhibitions, in public places and for other purposes not contrary to the international standards and the laws of the States participating in the Contest, for the duration of the exclusive right to the contest work from the date of its submission for the Contest, in all countries of the world.

The Organizer and the Co-organizers will be entitled to use the contest works in the following forms (including but not limited to): publication in the media, display on the Organizer's and Co-organizers' Internet platforms, in social networks, public demonstration in order to discuss the contest works by the contest audiences, organizing exhibitions and forums, including, in educational organizations, libraries, theme clubs, etc.

8.4. The Participant will guarantee that the license does not violate the third parties' rights and interests.

8.5. The Organizer and the Co-organizers may grant a license to third parties (sublicense).

8.6. The Organizer and the Co-organizers will not be obliged to provide reports on the use of Contest works.

8.7. The participant will allow the Organizer and the Co-organizers to use the contest works without specifying the names of their authors, a copyright holder, a Contest participant.

8.8. The participant will allow the Organizer and the Co-organizers to make changes in the Contest works, to supply the contest works with comments and explanations.

8.9. The Organizer and the Co-organizers will not be liable for the use of Contest works prepared by the participants in violation of the intellectual rights of third parties.

8.10. Participants will be liable under applicable international and national laws for violation of third-party intellectual property rights.

8.11. In the event of claims by third parties relating to the placement of Contest works on the Contest website, as well as subsequent use of Contest works in the above manner (clause 8.3), the participant will undertake to settle the claims of third parties using his/her own resources and at his/her own expense.

IX. Additional provisions

Due to the fact that the Contest is a non-commercial project, the remuneration to the participants, top winners and prize-winners of the Contest will not be paid. The rules of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation on public competitions (Chapter 57 "Public competition"), as well as the relevant laws of the States participating in the Contest, shall not apply to the Contest.

Russian Clarification on CVC queries

Query 1:- The Contest Rule 5.1.1 requires each participant to compulsorily register a personal account on the official Contest website <http://anticorruption.life>. Whether each participant of the Contest at National level has to upload his/her work on the official website through his/her personal account after registration. Considering the large number of participants across India, uploading of works by all of them will become un-wieldy. Whether the works of winners/select participants only, at National level will be uploaded through their personal account. This may please be clarified immediately.

Clarification

The official Contest website <http://anticorruption.life> allows a large number of participants to register and submit their works. Of course, you may define your own resources for accepting works at the national stage, but in our opinion the official Contest website is very convenient for each participant to register and upload his work there. If each participant uploads his work to the website himself (as suggested by the Contest rules), it will be easy for the national jury to receive the list of these works and participants, to download works, to see contact details of the participants and any other necessary information for the assessment and the selection of winners.

Last year, more than 10,000 works were uploaded to the site by the participants themselves, and there were no problems.

Query 2:- The Contest Rule 6.5 requires the National Contest Commission to submit the works of semi-final top winners as well as 10 additional works for utilizing them for exhibition (Album) on the Contest website, through email to the Organizer. The size of materials to be transmitted through e-mail to the Organizer would be in the range of 3 GB (cumulatively) which is technically not possible for e-mail transfer. Even a single video of 300 MB cannot be transferred through e-mail. Therefore, a way-out for online submission of Contest works to the Organizer may be clarified.

Clarification

We see no problems with the submission of works of semi-final top winners as well as 10 additional works to the organizers of the international stage of the Contest. You can either send each work by e-mail in a separate letter, or upload them to the cloud storage and send us a link to download.

Query 3:- The login registration form (under Tab "To come in") does not display the items in English for guiding the participants to fill the form correctly. The texts (watermarks inside the form fields) contained in the entry fields are in Russian language only. In the absence of English captions for each entry field, it is difficult to understand what is to be written therein.

Clarification

The website is currently being finalized. The login registration form display the items in English for guiding the participants to fill the form correctly (see: <http://anticorruption.lit/en/personal/auth/registration.php?register=yes&backurl=%2Fen%2Fpersonal%2Fauth%2F>) . Other texts are in English too.

Query 4: - Rule 5.1.2 of Contest Rules states that the Contest works will be electronically downloaded through a personal account on the Contest website. As each participant of the Contest is required to upload his work through his personal account, whether the authorities at National or Regional level will have access to the personal accounts of the participants or their works for electronically downloading them for assessment purposes? Or whether the uploaded works of all the participants will appear on the Contest website under section "Works of the contestants".

Clarification

We will provide the members of the national jury with access to the administrative interface of the site, where they may see the works of all the participants of their Country, upload them to the excel format, create lists, sort them, download works and receive personal data of the participants.



- Doctoral Course (Second Phase) – Masters Degree in the relevant field with minimum 65% marks. Candidates should have practical research/teaching/work experience after obtaining the prescribed qualification on or before 30th September 2021 for the October 2021 batch.

Age: The applicants must be under the age of 35 (born on or after April 2, 1986).

2. The other eligibility conditions, scholarship benefits etc. may be seen in the enclosed guidelines of the scholarship.

3. The Embassy of Japan, New Delhi is inviting application and **deadline of application is 09 July 2020**. Applicants are required to visit the following website (URL) of the Embassy of Japan, New Delhi to download the application form, for detailed information and application procedure:

APPLICATION GUIDELINES
JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP FOR 2021
(RESEARCH STUDENTS)

The Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan offers scholarships to international students who wish to study in graduate courses at Japanese universities as Research Students (either regular students or non-regular students) under the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Program as follows.

1. DEFINITION OF “RESEARCH STUDENTS”

Those who are enrolled in a master’s course, a doctoral course, or a professional graduate course at a graduate school, or who are conducting research in a specialized field at an undergraduate department, graduate school, institute attached to a university, etc. without the aim of completing the course, or who are receiving preparatory education in the Japanese language and other subjects prior to placement at the university, etc. (Excluding Young Leaders’ Program Students or Teacher Training Students.)

2. FIELDS OF STUDY

Applicants should apply for the field of study they majored in at university or its related field. Moreover, the fields of study must be subjects which applicants will be able to study and research in graduate courses at Japanese universities. The fields of study may be restricted to particular fields by the Japanese Embassy or Consulate (hereinafter referred to “Japanese diplomatic mission”) in the applicant’s country.

Traditional entertainment arts such as Kabuki and classical Japanese dances, or subjects that require practical training in specific technologies or techniques at factories or companies are not included in the fields of study under this scholarship program.

A student who studies medicine, dentistry or welfare science will not be allowed to engage in clinical training such as medical care and operative surgery until he/she obtains a relevant license from the Minister of Health, Labor and Welfare under applicable Japanese laws.

3. QUALIFICATIONS AND CONDITIONS

MEXT accepts applications from international students for study in Japan who satisfy the following qualifications and conditions. Its aim is to foster human resources who will become bridges of friendship between the grantee’s country and Japan through study in Japan and who will contribute to the development of both countries and the wider world.

- (1) **Nationality:** Applicants must have the nationality of a country that has diplomatic relations with Japan. An applicant who has Japanese nationality at the time of application is not eligible. However, persons with dual nationality who hold Japanese nationality and whose place of residence at the time of application is outside of Japan are eligible to apply as long as they choose the nationality of the other country and renounce their Japanese nationality by the date of their arrival in Japan. The First Screening must be conducted at the Japanese diplomatic mission in the country of which the applicant chooses the nationality.
- (2) **Age:** Applicants, in principle, must have been born on or after April 2, 1986. Exceptions are limited to cases in which MEXT deems that the applicant could not apply within the eligible age limit due to the situation or circumstances of the applicant’s country (military service obligation, loss of educational opportunities due to disturbances of war, etc.) Personal circumstances (financial situation, family circumstances, state of health, circumstances related to applicant’s university or place of employment, etc.) will not be considered for exceptions.
- (3) **Academic Background:** Applicants must satisfy any one of the following conditions for admission to either a master’s or doctoral course at a Japanese graduate school in which they wish to first enroll. (Applicants who will certainly satisfy any of the following conditions by the time of enrollment are eligible.)
 - (a) **Master’s course / Doctoral course (first phase)**
 - ① Applicants who have completed 16 years of school education in countries other than Japan.
 - ② Applicants who have completed a program with the standard study period of three years or more at universities or equivalent educational institutions in countries other than Japan and received a degree equivalent to a bachelor’s degree.
 - ③ Other than the above ① and ② conditions, applicants who are eligible for enrollment in a master’s course /doctoral course (first phase) at a Japanese graduate school.
 - (b) **Doctoral course (second phase)**
 - ① Applicants who have been awarded with an overseas degree equivalent to a master’s degree or professional degree.
 - ② Applicants who have graduated from universities and have been involved in research study at universities or

research centers (including overseas universities and research centers) for two years or more, and recognized as having academic competency equivalent to persons with a master's degree by the graduate school.

- ③ Other than the above ① and ② conditions, applicants who are eligible for enrollment in a doctoral course (second phase) at a Japanese graduate school.

(c) Doctoral course (faculties of medicine, dentistry, veterinary sciences and certain parts in pharmaceutical fields)

- ① Applicants who have completed 18 years of school education in countries other than Japan.
- ② Applicants who have completed a program with the standard study period of five years or more at universities or equivalent educational institutions in countries other than Japan and received a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree.
- ③ Applicants who have completed 16 years of school education in countries other than Japan and have been involved in research study at universities or research centers (including overseas universities and research centers) for two years or more, and recognized as having academic competency equivalent to university graduates in medicine, dentistry, veterinary sciences or certain parts in pharmaceutical fields by the graduate school.
- ④ Other than the above ①, ② and ③ conditions, applicants who are eligible for enrollment in a doctoral course (faculties of medicine, dentistry, veterinary sciences and certain parts in pharmaceutical fields) at a Japanese graduate school.

※ For (c) above, you must confirm necessary academic background details on the websites of the universities in which you wish to enroll since the academic background needed for admission may vary according to university. [For example, (c)-① stipulates that applicants must graduate from an undergraduate program in medicine, dentistry, veterinary or pharmaceutical sciences.]

(4) Japanese Language: Applicants must be willing to learn Japanese. Applicants must be interested in Japan and be willing to deepen their understanding of Japan after arriving in Japan. Applicants must also have the ability to do research and adapt to living in Japan.

(5) Health: Applicants must submit a health certificate in the prescribed format signed by a physician attesting that the applicant has no physical or mental conditions hindering the applicant's study in Japan.

(6) Arrival in Japan: Applicants must choose and fill in the Application Form October term. In principle, a change in the arrival period is not permitted after the submission of the Application Form.

October term: In principle, applicants must be able to arrive in Japan during the period specified by the accepting university within two weeks before and after the starting date of the university's relevant academic term (September or October) for that year.

Excluding cases in which MEXT deems as unavoidable circumstances, the applicant must withdraw from this scholarship program if the applicant cannot arrive in Japan by the end of the specified period above which decided by MEXT or the accepting university.

(7) Visa Requirement: An applicant shall, in principle, newly obtain a "Student" visa at the Japanese diplomatic mission located in the applicant's country of nationality, and enter Japan with the residence status of "Student." Accordingly, even if the applicant already has other residence status ("Permanent resident," "Long-term resident," etc.), the applicant must change it to the "Student" status and re-enter Japan. Moreover, the applicant should be aware that after expiration of the status as a MEXT Scholarship student and even if the student again applies for their original resident status of "Permanent resident" or "Long-term resident," such resident statuses might not be necessarily granted. The applicant should also be aware that the scholarship will be cancelled if he/she arrived in Japan without a newly obtained "Student" visa.

(8) Non-eligibility: Those who meet any one of the following conditions are ineligible. If identified ineligible after being selected as a scholarship student, he/she must withdraw from the scholarship.

- ① Those who are military personnel or military civilian employees at the time of their arrival in Japan or during the period of the payment of the scholarship;
- ② Those who cannot arrive in Japan by the last date of the period specified by MEXT or the accepting university;
- ③ Those who are previous grantees of Japanese Government (MEXT) scholarship programs (including those who withdraw from the scholarship program after the arrival in Japan). This does not apply to: those who have educational or work experience exceeding more than three years from the following month of the period of the previous scholarship to the estimated first month of the payment of this scholarship; and the past grantees of Japanese Studies Students program who have graduated or are going to graduate from universities in their home countries, Japan-Korea Joint Government Scholarship Program for the Students in Science and Engineering Departments and Young Leaders' Program. The Monbukagakusho Honors Scholarship for Privately-Financed International Students is not included in the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Programs;
- ④ Those who are currently also applying to another program under the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship system. This includes the programs for which scholarship payments will begin in FY2020,

although their final selection results have not been decided yet, and the programs for which scholarship payments will begin in FY2021;

- ⑤ Those who are already enrolled in a Japanese university or other institution with a residence status of “Student,” or who are going to be enrolled, or plan to enroll, in a Japanese university or other institution as a privately-financed international student from the time of application to the MEXT scholarship program in the applicant’s country until the commencement of the period for payment of the MEXT scholarship. However, this stipulation does not apply to privately-financed international students who, even though they are enrolled, or are planning to enroll, in a Japanese university or other institution, verifiably complete their studies before the start of the scholarship payment period, return to their home country at the time of the scholarship application, and newly acquire the “Student” residence status and come to Japan;
 - ⑥ Those who are planning to receive scholarship money from an organization other than MEXT (including a government organization of the applicant’s country) on top of the scholarship money provided by MEXT after the start of the scholarship payment period;
 - ⑦ Those who are expected to graduate at the time of application and cannot satisfy the condition of academic background by the deadline given;
 - ⑧ Holders of dual nationality at the time of application who cannot verify that they will give up Japanese nationality by the time of the arrival in Japan;
 - ⑨ Those who change their residence status to that of other than “Student” after their arrival in Japan;
 - ⑩ Those who plan to, from the time of application for the MEXT scholarship program, engage in long-term research (such as fieldwork or internship) outside Japan or plan to take a long-term leave of absence from the university;
 - ⑪ Those who have completed a doctoral course and have no intention to obtain a degree.
- (9) **Others:** MEXT Scholarship will be granted those who are willing to contribute to mutual understanding between Japan and their home country by participating in activities at schools and communities during their study in Japan while contributing to the internationalization of Japan. They shall also make efforts to promote relations between the home country and Japan by maintaining close relations with the university attended after graduation, cooperating with the conducting of surveys and questionnaires, and cooperating with relevant projects and events conducted by the Japanese diplomatic mission after they return to their home countries.

4. PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP

(1) Non-regular students:

The scholarship period will last from September or October 2021 until the end of March 2023.

The first 6-month period of scholarship will be a term of preparatory education of Japanese language (hereinafter referred to “the preparatory education”) for those who require such education. In cases of arrival in Japan in other months than those specified above, MEXT will decide the period of scholarship separately.

(Note 1) Scholarship payments will begin in September 2021 only if the start date of the accepting university’s autumn term is September 1, 2021. The scholarship payments will begin in October 2021 if the university’s autumn term start date falls between September 2, 2021, and September 30, 2021.

(2) Regular students enrolled in master’s, doctoral, or professional graduate courses:

Regardless of the date of arrival, the scholarship period shall be the necessary period for the completion of the respective regular course (hereinafter referred to “the standard period of study”. See “13. ACADEMIC PATHWAY FOR RESEARCH STUDENTS” for the standard period of study at each course). For those requiring preparatory education, a 6-month preparatory education period will be separately added prior to the regular degree course.

5. EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP

Non-regular students wishing to advance to a regular degree course in a graduate school as a regular student, or regular students in a master’s or professional graduate course wishing to proceed to a doctoral course, with outstanding academic achievement that meets certain criteria may apply for extension of the scholarship period for advanced study and may have the scholarship period extended upon a successful examination by MEXT. Followings are some points to note:

- ① The extension of the scholarship period will be permitted only if the successful student has passed an entrance examination for a regular degree course at a graduate school in which they wish to enroll and expresses his/her intention to enroll in the course.
- ② Non-regular students cannot extend the scholarship period as they stay in non-regular courses.
- ③ Students who are admitted to advanced courses without receiving approval for the extension of the scholarship period for advanced study cannot be granted the extension of the scholarship period. (In such cases, it is possible for the students to be enrolled in advanced courses as a privately-financed student.)

6. SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

(1) Allowance: The amounts listed below shall be paid depending on the course enrolled in. A supplemental regional allowance of 2,000 yen or 3,000 yen per month will be added to the monthly scholarship amount for the grantees studying or conducting research in specially designated regions. Due to the situation of the Japanese Government's budget, the amount of payment may be subject to change each fiscal year. If a grantee is absent from the university for an extended period, the scholarship shall be suspended for that period.

① Students receiving the preparatory education and non-regular students: 143,000 yen per month

② Regular students enrolled in master's or professional degree courses: 144,000 yen per month

③ Regular students enrolled in doctoral courses: 145,000 yen per month.

(2) Education fees: Fees for the entrance examination, matriculation, and tuition at universities will be paid by MEXT. The entrance examination fee, however, will be borne by the grantees if they cannot proceed to the master's or doctoral course or cannot be admitted by the university.

(3) Traveling Expenses

① **Transportation to Japan:** MEXT will stipulate the travel schedule and route, and provides an airline ticket to grantees who will arrive in Japan during the specified period stated in "3. (6) Arrival in Japan". The airline ticket will be an economy-class ticket for the flight from the international airport closest to the grantee's residence (in principle, the country of nationality) to an international airport in Japan used on the normal route to the accepting university. The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to domestic travel from the grantee's residence to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within Japan (including airline transit costs), travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc. The grantee shall also bear at his/her own expense travel and lodging costs incurred in a third country if the grantee must travel to a third country before coming to Japan for visa purposes because there are no Japanese diplomatic missions in his/her country, or if there are no direct flights from the grantee's country of residence to Japan. MEXT will provide an economy-class airline ticket from the grantee's country of residence to the said third country, and from the third country to an international airport in Japan used on the normal route to the accepting university. In principle, the address given in the space for "Your address before departure for Japan" on the application form shall be recognized as the "residence," and the airline ticket will be arranged for a flight from the international airport nearest to that address. Except for cases when the grantee must travel to a third country to obtain a visa, MEXT will not provide an airline ticket for cases of travel to Japan from a country other than the grantee's country of residence due to the grantee's personal circumstances. If a grantee will arrive in Japan before or after the specified period stated in "3. (6) Arrival in Japan", travel expenses will not be paid.

② **Transportation from Japan:** Based on the application by the grantee, MEXT will provide an airline ticket to grantees who shall graduate the accepting university and return to the home country by the end of the final month of the period of scholarship (See "4. PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP") designated by MEXT. MEXT shall provide an economy-class airline ticket from the international airport in Japan used for the normal route to and from the accepting university to the international airport (in principle, in the country of nationality) nearest to the returning grantee's residence. The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to travel from the grantee's residence in Japan to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within the country of nationality (including airline transit costs), travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc. If a grantee returns to the home country before the end of period of scholarship due to personal circumstances, or reasons stated in "7. SUSPENSION OF PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP", MEXT will not pay for the returning travel expenses.

If a grantee continues to stay in Japan after the scholarship period has ended (ex. proceeding to further education or being employed in Japan, continuing to register at the university), travel expenses for a temporary return will also not be paid.

7. SUSPENSION OF PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

Payment of the scholarship will be cancelled for the reasons given below. Should any of the following reasons apply, the grantee may be ordered to return a part of, or all of, the scholarship paid up to that time. Payment of the scholarship may also be stopped during the period up to the decision on the disposition of the matter.

① A grantee is determined to have made a false statement on his/her application;

② A grantee violates any article of his/her pledge to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology;

③ A grantee violates any Japanese laws and is sentenced and imprisoned for an indefinite period or for a period exceeding 1 year;

④ A grantee is suspended from his/her university or preparatory educational institution or receives other punishment, or is removed from enrollment; as a disciplinary action in accordance with school regulations of the accepting institution;

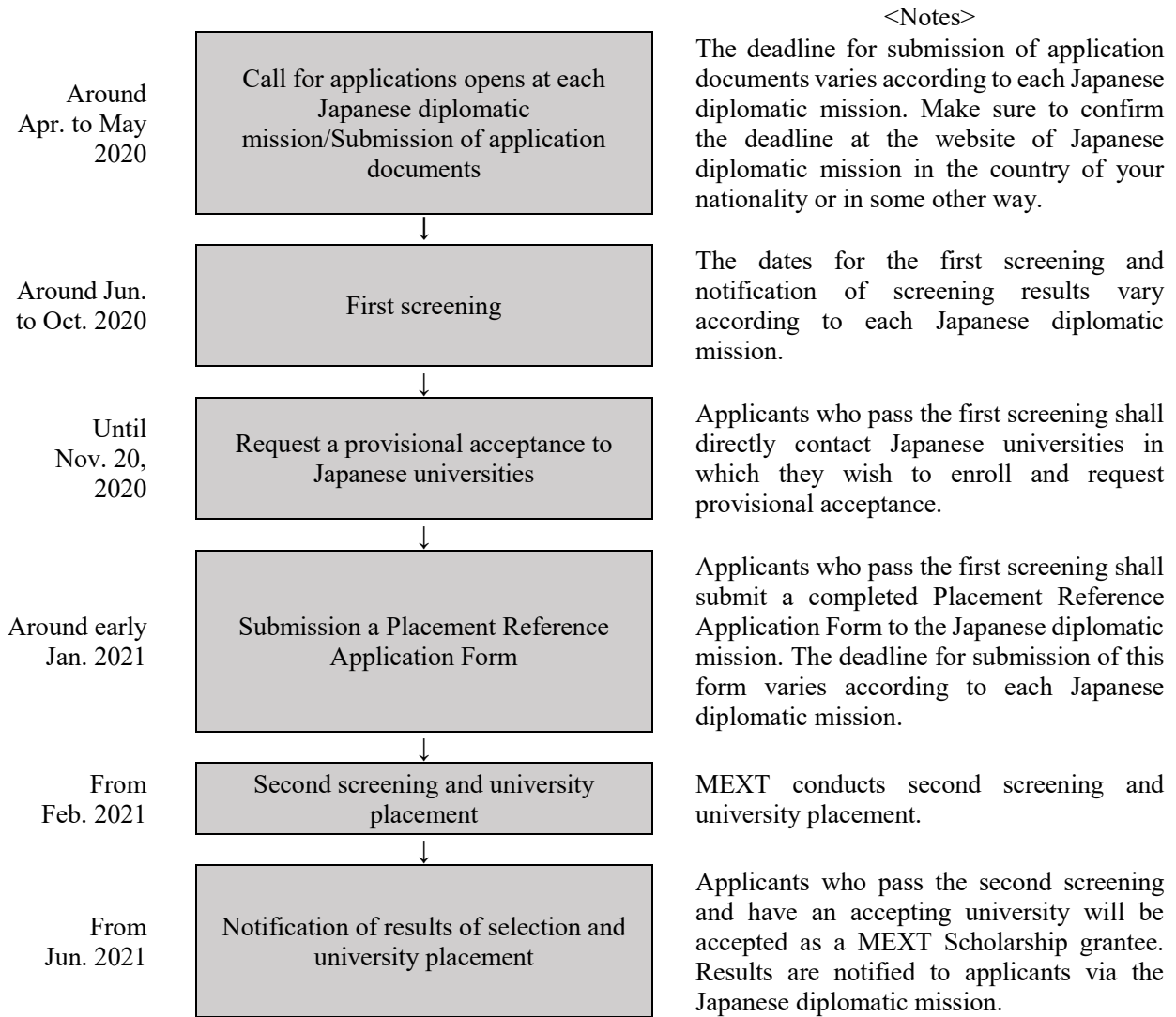
⑤ It has been determined that it will be impossible for a grantee to complete the course within the standard period of study because of poor academic grades or suspension or absence from the university or preparatory

educational institution;

- ⑥ A grantee came to Japan without newly acquiring the “Student” residence status, or changed his/her residence status to one other than “Student”;
- ⑦ A grantee has received another scholarship (excluding those specified for research expenditures);
- ⑧ A grantee proceeds to a more advanced level of education without receiving approval for an extension of the period of the scholarship.

8. THE PROCESS OF APPLICATION AND SELECTION

The following chart indicates the whole process from the call for applications, selection and final results. See the following Section 9. to 12. for more details.



9. APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

Applicants must submit the following documents to the Japanese diplomatic mission in the country of the applicant's nationality by the designated deadline. The submitted documents will not be returned.

(Note 1) Documents indicated by the white circle (○) must be submitted by all the applicants. Documents indicated by the black circle (●) should be submitted only if applicable.

(Note 2) These documents must be written in Japanese or English, or translation in either of these languages should be attached.

(Note 3) Write the document number, from ① to ⑪ (refer to the numbers in the table above) in the upper right-hand corner of the first page for all the documents.

(Note 4) The applicant's photograph to be attached to the Application Form should be of clear quality, taken within six months of submission, and printed on paper specially for photographs. The photograph should be 4.5 x 3.5 cm. upper-body, full-faced, no hats. Please write applicant's name and nationality on the back of the photograph. The photograph data can be pasted to the Application Form and printed out.

(Note 5) The sheet of Field of Study and Research Plan should describe the applicant's past and present field of study and research theme and plan in Japan as it will serve as an important reference for placement of the applicant to a university.

(Note 6) Applicants must submit the following documents according to his/her academic background:

- (a) Applicants who have already graduated from a university's undergraduate program: an academic transcript of the program;
- (b) Applicants who have already completed a degree program at a graduate school: academic transcripts of both the undergraduate and the graduate programs;
- (c) Applicants who are pursuing an undergraduate degree: an academic transcript that covers from the year of enrollment to the term for which grades have been determined at the time of application for the scholarship;
- (d) Applicants who are pursuing a graduate school degree: an academic transcript of the undergraduate program and an academic transcript of the degree program at the graduate school that covers from the year of enrollment to the term for which grades have been determined at the time of application

for the scholarship.

The academic transcripts should show the grade scale applied and the grades earned by the applicant in all the subjects studied for each year of study at the course attended. A degree certificate or a certificate simply showing the ranking of the applicant at the time of graduation will not substitute for academic transcripts. Those who are pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree must also submit a transcript when he/she graduates from that program by the time selection results are finalized.

(Note 7) Applicants must submit the following documents according to his/her academic background:

- (a) Applicants who have already graduated from a university's undergraduate program: a certificate of graduation from the undergraduate program;
- (b) Applicants who have already completed a graduate school degree: certificates of graduation from both the undergraduate and graduate programs;
- (c) Applicants who are pursuing an undergraduate degree: a certificate of prospective graduation from the undergraduate program;
- (d) Applicants who are pursuing a graduate degree: a certificate of graduation from the undergraduate program and a certificate of prospective graduation from the degree program at the graduate school.

A copy of the graduation certificate or the degree certificate is acceptable if the copy is attested by an authorized official of the university. (Do not submit the originals as the submitted documents will not be returned.) Those who are pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree must also submit a certificate of graduation when he/she graduates from that program by the time selection results are finalized.

(Note 8) For abstracts of the theses, abstracts of the graduation thesis and any presented papers will be acceptable. These abstracts will be used as basic data for evaluation of the applicant's academic ability. Make sure the applicant's name is on the first page of the abstracts.

(Note 9) If printing out the certificates from the Internet, print out and submit a page showing the applicant's name and the details of the relevant qualification (level, score, etc.).

10. FIRST SCREENING

- (1) The Japanese diplomatic missions will conduct the First Screening of applicants by means of examination of submitted application documents, written examinations of language proficiency and interviews.
- (2) The subjects of written examinations of language proficiency will be Japanese and English. Both subjects must be taken by all applicants. The result of the Japanese language examination will be used as reference for the Japanese-language preparatory education to be provided after the grantee's arrival in Japan.
- (3) The following policy will apply to each stage of screening:
 - ① Examination of submitted application documents: Must show that the applicant's academic achievement at the university that he/she last graduated from equaled to or exceeded a certain level, and state the applicant's research plan in a detailed and concrete manner;
 - ② Written examination of language proficiency: Must show language proficiency adequate for research in a Japanese university;
 - ③ Interview: Must reveal that the applicant has a clear sense of purpose relating to his/her study in Japan and has gathered information about Japanese universities. The interview must also reveal that the applicant has sufficient Japanese or English language ability to communicate with his/her academic advisor in Japan. If the applicant desires to study a subject that requires advanced Japanese language proficiency, the interview must show that the applicant has a considerable degree of Japanese language proficiency.
- (4) The date and time of the notification of the results of the First Screening will be specified separately by the Japanese diplomatic missions in the applicant's country; the reasons for the results of the screening will not be disclosed. Those who pass the First Screening will not necessarily be selected as the MEXT Scholarship grantees.
- (5) The results of the First Screening will be used as reference for the Second Screening and the university placement.

11. REQUEST OF PROVISIONAL ACCEPTANCE AND SUBMISSION OF A PLACEMENT FORM

- (1) A letter of provisional acceptance will greatly influence final selection results. Applicants may be rejected if they have not obtained any such letter. Applicants who have passed the First Screening should, therefore, ask universities they wish to attend to issue letters of provisional acceptance.
- (2) Applicants who have passed the First Screening shall directly contact the Japanese universities they wish to enter after the notification of the First Screening results by Friday, November 20, 2020 (Japan time) in order to request the issuance of letters of provisional acceptance as a regular or a non-regular student in graduate school. Applicants should be aware the following notes.
 - ① The number of universities which can be filled in the ②Placement Preference Application Form is up to three universities. The applicants can, however, obtain up to a maximum of two letters of provisional acceptance. Do not obtain more than two letters of provisional acceptance.
 - ② Applicants can contact up to a maximum of two universities at the same time. Do not contact more than two universities at the same time. If, however, they have received a rejection from one of the universities and

thus they have been waiting for reply from less than two universities, then they can newly contact another university for request a letter of provisional acceptance.

- ③ A contact with universities requesting issuance of a letter of provisional acceptance made on Saturday, November 21, 2020 or after is not permitted.
 - ④ Since the above “Friday, November 20, 2020 is not the deadline for the universities to issue a letter of provisional acceptance, applicants must not urge the universities for the issuance. However, applicants may confirm with the university if the scheduled time of the issuance is delayed. In addition, applicants should keep it in mind when scheduling request letters of provisional acceptance that universities generally need one month to issue a letter of provisional acceptance.
 - ⑤ Applicants should first contact the division of international student affairs at the university (not an academic advisor you wish to be supervised by) to request a letter of provisional acceptance. (MEXT will inform the divisions of international student affairs beforehand that applicants who have passed the first screening may contact them.) The Japanese diplomatic mission can provide a list of contact information.
 - ⑥ The information on useful websites to search Japanese universities and researchers are also available from the Japanese diplomatic mission.
- (3) When requesting universities for issuance of a letter of provisional acceptance, applicants must submit directly to universities the following documents (a) and (b).
- (a) Copy of a Passing Certificate of the First Screening issued by the Japanese diplomatic mission
 - (b) A set of copies of the following documents submitted to the Japanese diplomatic mission among the “9. APPLICATION DOCUMENTS” that have been stamped by the Japanese diplomatic mission and returned to the applicants
- ① Application Form
 - ③ Field of Study and Research Plan
 - ④ Academic transcript for all academic year of university attended
 - ⑤ Certificate of graduation or degree certificate of the university attended
 - ⑥ Recommendation letter from the president/dean or the academic advisor at the current or last university attended
 - ⑧ Abstracts of theses (*Only if submitted to the Japanese diplomatic mission)
 - ⑨ Certificate of language proficiency (*Only if submitted to the Japanese diplomatic mission)
 - ⑩ Recommendation letter from the present employer (*Only if submitted to the Japanese diplomatic mission)
 - ⑪ Photograph(s) showing applicant’s own works of art or a digitally recorded media of musical performance (*Only if submitted to the Japanese diplomatic mission)

Applicants must submit any other necessary documents requested by universities. Do not submit “②Placement Preference Application Form” and “⑦Medical Certificate” to the universities.

The above documents (a) and (b) should be sent by e-mail, but in cases when it is difficult to access the Internet, the documents may be sent by postal mail. Please make sure each document ①, ③ to ⑥, and ⑧ to ⑪ have been stamped, and that all lettering and photographs are clear and legible. Please also note that if a copy of the Passing Certificate of the First Screening is not submitted, the university cannot comply with the request to issue a letter of provisional acceptance.

- (4) Applicants must always report the response from the universities and submit the final Placement Preference Application Form based on the responses from the universities and obtained letters of provisional acceptance to the Japanese diplomatic mission by the specified deadline. It is not allowed to fill in the Placement Preference Application Form the names of universities and all departments at the universities that have declined the applicant’s request.
- (5) Applicants should confirm carefully with the universities the period of arrival in Japan because it is not permitted, in principle, to change the specified period of arrival.

12. SECOND SCREENING AND UNIVERSITY PLACEMENT

- (1) MEXT conducts the Second Screening based on the results of the First Screening conducted by the Japanese diplomatic mission in the applicant’s country, and selects the applicants as the MEXT Scholarship Students as long as their placement to universities have been decided.

An application may be rejected if it arouses proliferation concerns including those over weapons of mass destruction (WMD) and related items, e.g. a case where it is highly possible that the applicant will receive the technology that is controlled pursuant to United Nations Security Council resolutions, or that any WMD-related technologies will be transferred to an applicant who belongs to (an) organization(s) on the End User List published by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry of Japan.

- (2) An applicant who successfully passes the Second Screening will, in principle, be placed at the university from which the applicant has received a letter of provisional acceptance. MEXT will hold consultations with the three

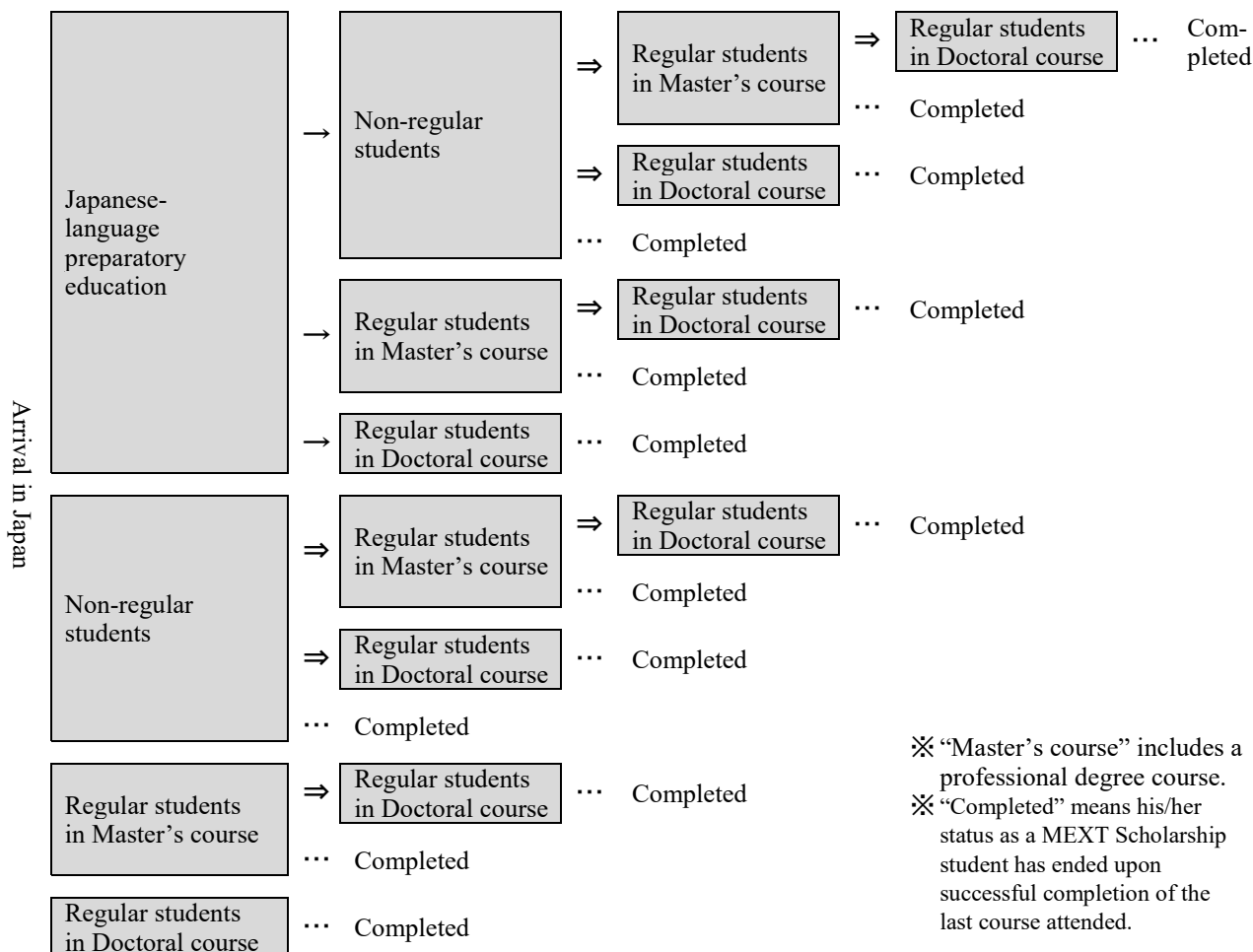
preferred universities listed in the applicant's Placement Preference Application Form and place the applicant at the university that approves the admittance as result of the consultation.

In case that the applicant's preferences include a private or non-national public university as well as a national university, the applicant's preference order specified in his/her Placement Preference Application Form may not be met due to restrictions on the Japanese government's budget, and the option of national university may be prioritized regardless.

- (3) Applicants who receive a letter of provisional acceptance to the regular course at a graduate school will be directly placed in the said regular course without going through the period of the non-regular student.
- (4) If an applicant is judged by the accepting university, based on the results of the written examination of language given in the First Screening, not to have adequate Japanese language proficiency to understand lectures or research guidance for experiments or practical training at the university, the applicant will be placed in a course of Japanese-language preparatory education at an institution designated by the accepting university or MEXT for the first six-month period after the arrival in Japan. Upon completion of the Japanese language course, the grantee will enter the accepting university for advanced education.
- (5) If a grantee is deemed by the accepting university to have sufficient Japanese language proficiency to conduct research, the grantee may directly enter the accepting university as a regular student or a non-regular student.
- (6) Applicants will be notified by the Japanese diplomatic mission of the final selection results and the grantees' accepting university from June 2021. Any objections to the decision on the university placement will not be accepted.

13. ACADEMIC PATHWAY FOR RESEARCH STUDENTS

The following chart indicates possible academic pathway as a MEXT Scholarship Research Student.



- (1) In the above chart, the single-lined arrow → indicates that the application for extension of the scholarship period is unnecessary. The double-lined arrow ⇒ indicates that the application for extension of the scholarship period will be necessary to proceed to a higher program. Extension of the scholarship period will be permitted only if the successful student has passed an entrance examination for a regular degree program at a graduate school. (See "5. EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP".)
- (2) While the entrance examinations to graduate school vary depending on universities, assessment of the applicant's foreign language competence, grasp of the specialized subject for study, plans for the graduation thesis,

interview, etc. are normally included.

- (3) The degree courses at the university's graduate schools under the Japanese school system include as follows.
- ① Master's degree course: The standard period of study is two years subsequent to graduation from a university. In some courses, the duration is less than two years but more than one year. Students who complete a master's degree course are awarded a Master's Degree.
 - ② Doctoral degree course: A three-year degree course subsequent to completion of a master's degree course. In the fields of medicine, dentistry and veterinary science, and pharmacy which is based on a 6-year undergraduate course, most of the universities offer only 4-year doctoral courses. Applicants are required to have completed 18 years of school education. Students who complete a doctoral degree course are awarded a Doctoral Degree.
 - ③ Professional degree course: A course at a professional graduate school. The standard period of study is two years. In some fields of study, the duration is less than two years but more than one year. Student who complete a professional degree course are awarded a Professional Degree. Graduate law schools offer a three-years course and students who complete the course are also awarded a Professional Degree (so-called a Juris Doctor).

14. NOTES

- (1) The grantees are advised to learn, before departing for Japan, the Japanese language and to acquire information about Japanese weather, climate, customs, university education, and conditions of the university to attend in Japan, as well as about the difference between the Japanese legal system and that of his/her home country.
- (2) As the first installment of the scholarship payment will be made from one month to one and a half months after the grantee's arrival in Japan, the grantee is recommended to bring at least approximately US\$2,000 with him/her to Japan to cover immediate living expenses and other necessary expenses.
- (3) The scholarship payments will be transferred to the bank account of Japan Post Bank (JP Bank) opened by each grantee after the arrival in Japan. MEXT will not transfer the scholarship payments to other account.
- (4) Grantees must enroll in National Health Insurance (Kokumin Kenko Hoken) upon arrival in Japan.
- (5) It is suggested that grantees acquire a "My Number Card" upon arrival in Japan.
- (6) Accommodations:
 - ① Residence halls for international students provided by universities: Some universities have residence halls for international students. The grantees enrolled at such universities may reside at these residence halls under certain conditions. However, due to the limited number of rooms, some of these facilities may be unavailable. Expenses relating to accommodations will be borne by the grantee.
 - ② Private boarding houses or apartments: Those who are unable to find accommodation in the aforementioned facilities may live in regular dormitories of the university or in private boarding houses/apartments with his/her expenses. It is difficult for grantees with dependents (spouse and children) to find appropriate housing in Japan. The grantee is requested to arrive in Japan alone first to secure housing before having his/her dependents come to Japan.
- (7) Information regarding the MEXT Scholarship Students (name, gender, date of birth, nationality, accepting university/graduate school/undergraduate school, field of specialty, period of enrolment, career path after completion of scholarship, contact information [address, telephone number, e-mail address]) may be shared with other relevant government organizations for the purpose of utilization for international students programs implemented by the Japanese Government (support during period of study in Japan, follow-up survey, improvement of the international student system).

Information regarding MEXT Scholarship Students (excluding date of birth and contact information) may be included in publicity materials prepared by the Japanese Government for promoting the acceptance of international students in Japan, particularly in order to introduce former MEXT Scholarship Students who are playing active roles in countries around the world.

These matters are included in the Pledge stipulating rules and regulations which MEXT Scholarship Students must comply with and submit when they have been granted the Scholarship.

- (8) The English texts attached to the Application Guidelines and the Application Form are for complementary use only. English expressions do not change the Japanese content.
- (9) If there are any questions about the content of the written text in this Application Guidelines or any other matters, applicants/grantees should inquire the Japanese diplomatic mission in the country of the applicant's nationality and follow their instructions.
- (10) In addition to the regulations stipulated in this Application Guidelines, those that are necessary to implement the Japanese Government Scholarship programs shall be determined by the Japanese Government.

- The **Research Program** candidates are selected from **155** countries that are invited to take part in 2020 Global Korea Scholarship for Graduate degrees. There is no reserved quota per country.
- The **Research Program** applicants must receive invitation from universities prior to applying to this program.
- The **Research Program** applicants submit their application either to the Korean embassy in the country where they hold the citizenship or to one of our partner universities listed in III. Available Universities and Fields of Study)

2. Available Fields of Study

- Applicants must choose their majors (fields of study) that are only listed in the “**University Information**” file.
- Please be advised that even if a university’s departments or majors you intend to apply offer English-taught courses, it may vary by lectures offered each term. Thus, we highly advise you to double check with your university. Furthermore, we would like applicants to keep in mind that Korean is the core language to be used in every Korean university.
- Night School, Short-term seasonal programs, online and distant-learning programs are not available to apply and admission is not permitted.

IV. ELIGIBILITY

1. Nationality

- All applicants and their parents must not hold Korean citizenship.
- Korean citizens and dual citizenship holders (one who have Korean citizenship and citizenship of another country) are NOT eligible to apply.
- Applicants and their parents who had previously held Korean citizenship must submit the document that proves their renunciation of Korean citizenship.
(※Exception: For overseas Korean applicants holding Japanese citizenship, if their parents hold

‘Permanent Residency Permit’ within Japan while holding Korean citizenship, are eligible to apply.)

2. Age

- Must be under 40 years of age as of September 1, 2020 (born after September 1, 1980)
- Academic professors who are under 45 years of age as of September 1, 2020 (born after September 1, 1975) and hold citizenship of one of the Official Development Assistance (ODA) recipients listed in the table below are eligible to apply.

3. Degree Requirements

- Applicants must hold or must be expected to hold a Bachelor’s, Master’s or a Doctoral degree by August 31st, 2020.
 - Doctoral Program Applicants: Must hold a Master’s degree or a level of education equivalent to a Master’s degree
 - Master’s Program Applicants: Must hold a Bachelor’s degree or a level of education equivalent to a Bachelor’s degree
 - Research Program Applicants: Must hold a degree or a level of education equivalent to or higher than a Master’s degree and must have received an invitation from one of NIIED’s designated Korean universities.
 - Postdoctoral Research Program: Must hold a doctoral degree or a level of education equivalent to a doctoral degree.
 - Professor Exchange Program: Must hold a Master’s degree or a level of education equivalent to or higher than a Master’s degree.
 - Program for Education ·Science ·Culture ·International Professionals: Must hold a Master’s degree or a level of education equivalent to or higher than a Master’s degree.

- Applicants who are expected to graduate at the time of applying must first submit the certificate of expected graduation at the time of applying. The official degree certificate (or diploma) and final academic transcript must be submitted by August 31st, 2020 at the very latest.
 - In case an applicant fails to submit the above mentioned document by August 31st, 2020 or does not fulfill the grade requirement, the scholarship will be forfeited.
- Prospective applicants who have attained a Bachelor's, Master's, or a doctoral degree in Korea are NOT eligible to apply. (※**Exception:** Overseas Korean Adoptees and GKS scholars)
- Applicants who have previously studied in a Korean university as exchange or visiting students can apply to this program.
- **[Applicants of Korean Language Teaching Professionals]:** Korean language instructors in the countries with allocated quota are eligible to apply for the program with the following conditions:
 - Occupation must be **elementary/secondary school teacher, university lecturer, or professor teaching Korean language** at a government-authorized education institution
 - Must receive a recommendation letter from the chairman of the employed institution.
 - Must have **at least 2 years** of teaching career (as of February 29, 2020)
 - Must hold (or be expected to hold) a bachelor's or above degree in Korean-related major
 - Must hold a **TOPIK level 4** or above (valid TOPIK score required as a proof)
 - Must **major in Korean Language Education under GKS** (Applicants must apply as a 'Korean Language Education' major. **Korean Language Education includes Teaching Korean to Speakers of Other Languages)
 - **Must apply to a higher level degree**
 - ex) A master's degree holder cannot apply for the master's degree and **MUST** apply for the doctoral degree.
- **[GKS Scholars re-applying to the program]:** The former or current GKS scholars who have attained or is expected to obtain the degree as of August 31st, 2020 are eligible to apply under following conditions:
 - Submit their applications either through the Embassy Track or the University Track and must be selected from one of those two institutions in the 1st round of selection.
 - Can only re-apply for a higher degree program once (Bachelor's→ Master's, Master's→ Doctoral) and must have overall grade point average equivalent to or higher than 90%.

4. Grades

- ※ GPA: Grade Point Average, CGPA: Cumulative (overall) Grade Point Average
- All applicants must have maintained the overall grade point average (CGPA) equivalent to or higher

than any ONE of the following from their respective universities:

- 2.64 on a 4.0 scale;
 - 2.80 on a 4.3 scale;
 - 2.91 on a 4.5 scale;
 - 3.23 on a 5.0 scale; or
 - Score percentile: 80% or above on a 100 point scale **or** be ranked within the top 20% within one's class (Exception: Previous or current GKS scholars must hold the grade of 90% or above on a 100 point scale **or** be ranked within the top 10% within one's class)
- Refer to Appendix A for the GPA Conversion table
 - If an applicant has a CGPA below the minimum grade requirement, the applicant will be disqualified and application will be disregarded.
 - If an applicant holds a transcript that does not include information on grade point average or is unable to convert his or her grades into any one of the GPA criteria mentioned above, then applicant must submit an official document issued by the applicant's university describing the university's grade system.

5. Health

- All applicants must be in good health, both mentally and physically, to study in Korea for the full duration of degree or research programs.
- All applicants must submit Form 6 or the "Personal Medical Assessment" at the time of applying.
- All applicants who pass the 2nd round of selection must receive comprehensive medical checkup and submit the certificate of health and medical examination result issued by a medical doctor or a licensed physician.
- If an applicant is found to be in one of the following conditions, the applicant will be disqualified in the final round of selection:
 - An applicant is tested positive on drug tests;
 - An applicant who owns serious illness that prevents him or her to study abroad for long period of time including the full duration of degree or research program in Korea.

6. Restriction

- Prospective applicants who have attained a Bachelor's, Master's, or a doctoral degree in Korea are NOT eligible to apply. (***Exception:** Overseas Korean Adoptees and GKS scholars)
*Applicants who have previously studied in a Korean university as exchange or visiting students can apply to this program.

- Former applicants who had withdrawn from the scholarship after being selected as GKS scholars (applicable to those who did not come to Korea after being selected as GKS scholars and who had resigned from their studies) in the past are strictly NOT eligible to apply. However, a former GKS scholar whose scholarship was forfeited due to a scholar's failure to achieve TOPIK level 3 or above after completing Korean language program may be deemed eligible to reapply if a scholar receive TOPIK level 5 or above.
- (Prior Notice) Effective 2021

[※ Restriction for GKS scholars who are reapplying to the program]

-GKS scholars who are reapplying to the program MUST hold TOPIK level 5 or 6 in order to reapply for the program starting from 2021 GKS Graduate Program.

7. Preference

- Applicants who received outstanding scores for their proficiency in Korean or English may be given preference. Some examples include the followings:
 - Proficiency in Korean: TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean)
 - Proficiency in English: TOEFL, TOEIC, or IELTS Academic (TOEFL ITPs are NOT acceptable)
- Applicants who apply for majors in the field of Natural Science and Engineering are given priority when they receive same marks with other candidates.
- Applicants who apply for majors under the *Industrial Professionals Training Project* are given priority when they receive same marks with other candidates.
- Academic professors holding citizenship of developing countries, especially ODA recipients, are given priority when they receive same marks with other candidates.
- Descendants of Korean War veterans will receive additional 5% of the total marks.
- Applicants from low income families or underprivileged backgrounds will be given preference.
- Applicants who are confirmed to be the 'third generation' or 'post-third generation' overseas Koreans will be given preference.

2. Notes for ALL Applicants

- All application documents must be written either in Korean or English.
- Documents written in languages other than Korean or English must accompany a complete Korean or English translation, authenticated by the issuing institution or notarized by a notary public.
- All application documents must be presented in their original forms. If an applicant has to submit photocopied documents, applicant MUST have the photocopies notarized, apostilled, or receive consular confirmation and submit those certified documents.

******For the applicants who are certain that they will not be able to get their academic**

documents reissued in the future, we strongly recommend them to submit notarized, apostilled or consular-confirmed academic documents in lieu of original documents.

- All documents submitted will NOT be returned to the applicants in any case.
- Application documents must be submitted in the order of the checklist on the first page of the application forms. Each required document must be numbered and labeled on the top right corner. (ex. **9. Certificate of Bachelor's degree**)
- Any fraudulent or incomplete applications will be disregarded and even if a scholar has been selected, he or she will forfeit his or her scholarship if the application is found fraudulent.
- Applicants who are expected to graduate at the time of applying must first submit the certificate of expected graduation at the time of applying. The official degree certificate (or diploma) and final academic transcript must be submitted by August 31st, 2020 at the very latest.
 - If an applicant fails to submit official degree certificate (or diploma) and final academic transcript by August 31st, 2020 or does not fulfill the grade requirement, the scholarship will be forfeited.
- The recommendation letters must be written by two different recommenders, who can give thorough assessment on applicant's academic abilities.
 - The applicants of Korean Language Teaching Professionals must include a recommendation letter written by the chairman of their employed institution (the Principal of the School or the President of the University).
- The recommenders must seal recommendation letters in an envelope and sign across the back flap. The letters with broken seal or sign will be considered invalid.
- For the published papers, research papers, and awards, photocopies are acceptable.
- The proof of citizenship must be government-issued documents. The examples include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - An original birth certificate issued by the government of the applicant's country;
 - An original family register issued by the government of the applicant's country
 - Passport copies of the applicant and applicant's parent (No need for notarization)

- **Certificate of Employment (Teaching Career):** The teaching subject MUST be indicated as **Korean Language**.
- **Degree Certificate:** MUST hold a degree in Korean-related major (such as Korean language, Korean Studies, Teaching Korean to Speakers of Other Language, and etc.)
- **Recommendation letters:** At least ONE of the recommendation letters must be written by

the chairman of their employed institution (the Principal of the School or the President of the University).

3. Embassy Track Applicants

- Must submit **ONE set of** original application forms and **THREE sets of** photocopied application forms.

4. University Track Applicants

- Must submit **ONE set of** original application documents.

5. Research Program Applicants

- Must submit **ONE set of** original application documents.

VI. SELECTION PROCEDURES

1. Application Submission

- Applicants must apply either to a Korean Embassy where they hold citizenship or directly to one of designated universities.
- Institutions accepting applications
 - **116 Embassies of the Republic of Korea:** In countries where Korean Education Center or Korean Cultural Center is located, these institutions may accept and review GKS applications in lieu of Korean embassies. We highly recommend applicants to contact Korean embassy in their countries to check which party is accepting the application.
 - **64 Korean Universities designated by NIED**
- If an applicant submit application to more than ONE institution mentioned above, his or her application will be discarded.
- Overseas Koreans must apply to the Korean embassies in their home countries. Only those who own citizenships of the countries with the separate Overseas Koreans quota (refer to II.) are eligible to apply.
- The applicants of Korean Language Teaching Professionals must apply only to the Korean embassies in their home countries. Only those who own citizenships of the countries with the separate Korean Language Teaching Professionals quota (refer to II.) are eligible to apply.
- **Chinese applicants** must submit their applications to the China Scholarship Council, in accordance with the agreement between the government of Korea and the government of China.
- **The Czech Republic applicants** must submit their applications to the Ministry of Education of the

Czech Republic, in accordance with the agreement between the Korean government and the Czech Republic government.

2. Deadline of Application Submission

- The application deadline is set by each Korean embassy or university.
- All applicants must check the deadline of application submission by contacting the relevant embassy or desired university directly.

3. University and Field of Study Choice

- Embassy Track Applicants
 - Applicants must choose **THREE different** desired universities and available fields of study among 64 universities listed in section III (Type A + Type B) but **MUST include at least one university from Type B.**
 - Applicants that pass the 2nd round of selection will go through university admission in the 3rd round of selection (Refer to “4. Selection Procedure” below).
- University Track Applicants
 - Applicants must choose a major and **ONE** desired university among 64 universities.
- For the list of universities and fields of study that are available to apply, please refer to the “University Information” file attached along with GKS-G announcement post.

4. Selection Procedure

1st round of Selection

Applicants submit applications to the relevant Korean Embassies or Korean universities designated by NIIED. Each embassy and university selects candidates among the applicants based on NIIED’s selection criteria.

- Each embassy and university will send the 1st round successful candidates’ applications and related documents to NIIED by April 3, 2020.

2nd round of Selection

The NIIED Selection Committee conducts the 2nd round of selection among candidates that passed the 1st round of selection.

- University Track applicants who pass the 2nd round of selection are confirmed admission to the university. In order to be selected as GKS scholars, these University Track applicants MUST submit their comprehensive medical examination results and other additional required documents.
- Comprehensive Medical Examination
 - All candidates who pass the 2nd round must get comprehensive medical examinations based on NIIED’s Certificate of Health form and submit the medical examination result issued by a medical doctor or a licensed physician.
 - The Certificate of Health form will be posted in the GKS Notice board along with the announcement of successful candidates of 2nd round of selection.
 - If the medical examination result shows that an applicant is not suitable to study and live overseas for the extended period of time, he or she will be disqualified.

**3rd round of Selection
(Embassy Track Applicants
ONLY)**

The applications of the 2nd round successful candidates will finally be reviewed by the universities for admission. The final round successful candidates must receive admission from at least one of the universities they applied in order to be selected as GKS Scholars.

5. Application Screening and Evaluation

- Applications will be reviewed by each round’s selection committee.
- Each selection committee will consider various factors when screening applications such as the following:
 - Academic Transcript
 - Personal Statement
 - Statement of Purpose or Research Proposal
 - Letters of recommendation
 - Certificates of Language Proficiency (Korean or English), publications, awards, and etc.

 - Entry to Korea: An economy class flight ticket from GKS scholar’s home country to Korea

VIII. PERIOD OF SCHOLARSHIP

1. Doctoral Degree Program: 4 years (2020. 9. 1. ~ 2024. 8.31.)

- 1 year of Korean language program
- 3 years of regular degree program

2. Master's Degree Program: 3 years (2020. 9. 1. ~ 2023. 8.31.)

- 1 year of Korean language program
- 2 years of degree program

3. Research Program: 6 Months (2020. 9. 1. ~ 2021. 2.28.) / 1 year (2020.9. 1. ~ 2021.8.31.)

4. Important Notes regarding Scholarship Period

- The scholarship period for the degree (Master's-2years, Doctoral-3years) and research program (6months ~ 1 year) cannot be extended once the scholarship is terminated.
- The change in period during the Korean language program will not affect the scholarship period for the degree program. In other words, even if a scholar's language program shortens to 6months instead of a year, the scholarship period that GKS supports for his or her degree program will remain the same (2 years for Master's degree and 3 years for Doctoral degree).
- GKS scholars with TOPIK level 5 or 6
 - GKS scholars who have already received valid TOPIK level 5 or 6 at the time of applying are exempt from a yearlong Korean language program. Thus, the total scholarship period will be 2years for Master's degree scholars and 3years for Doctoral degree scholars.
 - Those who receive TOPIK level 5 or 6 within the first 6months of the Korean language program will be exempt from 6-month language training and must start their degree program in the following semester. The total scholarship period for these scholars will be shortened to 2.5 years for Master's degree scholars and 3.5years for Doctoral degree scholars.
- Research program scholars, upon their completion of the program and before returning back to their countries, must submit their thesis or research results that include methods, data collection, and discussion of the findings as well as the academic advisor's evaluation on scholar's performance.

IX. KOREAN LANGUAGE PROGRAM

- All scholars, unless exempt, must take one year mandatory Korean Language Program at Korean language institutions assigned by NIIED.
- Exemption of the Korean Language Program
 - GKS scholars who have already received a valid TOPIK level 5 or 6 at the time of applying are exempt from the yearlong Korean language program and must directly enroll in degree program.
 - GKS scholars who receive TOPIK level 5 or 6 within the first 6months of the Korean language program are exempt from the subsequent 6-month language training and must start their degree program in the following semester.
 - All applicants and scholars must submit valid TOPIK certificates to NIIED.
 - If one wishes to be exempt from the Korean language program, the 70th TOPIK score is the last TOPIK score one can report to NIIED to request for exemption from the Korean language program. One must submit the valid TOPIK certificate to NIIED and his or her university by end of June, 2020.

- Korean language institution is assigned to each student based on following criteria:
 - The language institution is not located in the same city as the scholar’s degree pursuing university.
 - The language institution should provide a variety of Korean cultural experiences in addition to offering focused and professional Korean language training
- Korean language institution for each GKS scholar will be announced along with the list of finally selected GKS scholars.
- GKS scholars cannot change their assigned Korean language institutions in any case.
- GKS scholars must live on-campus during the Korean language program.
 - Most dormitory rooms are shared with roommates.
 - Accompanying family members is strictly forbidden during the Korean language program.
 - A scholar with a valid TOPIK level 3 or above may choose to live on- or off-campus.
- Prerequisites for proceeding to the degree program
 - **ALL GKS scholars MUST achieve at least level 3 on TOPIK by the end of one year Korean language program**, in order to proceed to the degree program.

X. OTHER IMPORTANT NOTES

1. Medical Insurance

- Universities and Korean language institutions will enroll in medical insurance plan on behalf of GKS scholars.
- The medical insurance plan will be effective immediately after one’s arrival in Korea.
- The medical fees incurred during the insurance enrollment period will be reimbursed by the insurance company.
 - If a GKS scholar has to receive medical treatment, one must first pay for the medical bills and submit receipts to one’s insurance company.
 - The insurance company will refund partial or full amount of the medical bills (depending on the insurance plan). It is GKS scholar’s responsibility to check the insurance terms and policies provided to the scholar when one enrolls in the insurance plan.
- The medical insurance will not cover the expenses for dental care or chronic disease.

2. Scholarship Withdrawal and Cancellation

- One who withdraws from the scholarship after being selected as a GKS scholar will NOT receive degree completion grants and airfare for returning back to one’s country. However, a former GKS

scholar who forfeited scholarship due to a scholar's failure to achieve TOPIK level 3 or above after completing Korean language program may be deemed eligible to reapply if a scholar receive TOPIK level 5 or above.

- If a GKS scholar withdraws from the scholarship within the first 3months after entering Korea, one MUST return the full scholarship amount that he or she has received after being selected as GKS scholar. This will include the airfare from one's home country to Korea, settlement allowance, monthly allowance, language training fees, medical insurance fees, and etc.

3. Restriction on changing universities and degree

- Changing the university or transferring to a different university under this scholarship is NOT, in any case, permitted.
- Changing a major may be allowed under restricted conditions including, but not limited to the following:
 1. With the approval from a scholar's university and concerned departments;
 2. With the scholarship period unchanged (2 years for Master's degree and 3 years for Doctoral degree).

4. To applicants who are residing in Korea

- If you are selected as a GKS scholar while residing in Korea, it is your responsibility to take care of all the visa matters such as visa change, extension, and etc. You will have to check with the immigration's office ahead in order to prevent inconvenience and obstacles that may occur regarding visa issues. If a scholar has to go back to one's country for a visa change, you will have to pay for the airfare at your own expense.

Online applications are invited from Indian nationals for '2020 COMMONWEALTH MASTER' SCHOLARSHIP TENABLE IN THE UNITED KINGDOM' for pursuing one year Master's Degree Courses commencing from September/October 2020. The Scholarships are offered by the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission (CSC), UK.

Online Applications:

Candidates are required to apply online at the following portals:

- **Ministry of Human Resource Development portal:**

Link for online application: <http://proposal.sakshat.ac.in/scholarship/>. The portal would be active from 01 October 2019 to 15 November 2019.

- **Commonwealth Scholarship Commission's Online Application System (OAS):**

Link for OAS: https://fs29.formsite.com/m3nCYq/iy6rpgiqua/form_login.html. The OAS is active from 28 August 2019 to 30 October 2019.

Note : It is compulsory for the applicant to apply on both the portals before their respective deadline, failing which his/her candidature would be deemed ineligible.

Note : The last date for applying on CSC OAS is 30 October 2019.

Note : CSC has offered scholarship for pursuing Master's Course (one year) only. Master Degree programs which are less than 2 years in duration, are not equivalent to Master Degree in India.

Note: CSC does not offer scholarship for pursuing MBA.

Number of nominations:

39 nominations would be made to the CSC. The CSC will tentatively inform this Ministry of the selected candidates by June 2020.

Eligibility:


- (i) The applicant must be a Citizen of India.
- (ii) The applicant must be a permanent resident of India.
- (iii) The applicant must be available to start his/her academic studies in the UK by the start of the UK academic year in September/October 2020.
- (iv) The applicant should have completed or is expected to complete his/her Bachelor Degree by October 2020.
- (v) The applicant must not be able to afford to study in the UK without this scholarship. (*Candidates are compulsorily required to sign a declaration that they do not have access to sufficient funds to study in the UK.*)
- (vi) Candidates who have already been abroad for studies/training/ specialization either on scholarships or on their own, for a period exceeding six months are eligible to apply, if they have been in India for at least two consecutive years as on 'date' after returning from abroad.

Commonwealth Master's Scholarship is offered under the following themes:

- Science and technology for development
- Strengthening health systems and capacity
- Promoting global prosperity
- Strengthening global peace, security and governance
- Strengthening resilience and response to crises
- Access, inclusion and opportunity.

Selection and nomination

- Candidates who have received an offer of admission from any participating universities must upload a copy of the same on the Ministry's portal at the time of online application, failing which their candidature will not be considered.
- In case there are more number of students than the available nominations, in that scenario, ranking of the University as per the 'QS Ranking 2020' would be taken to draw up the merit list.
- Theme-wise nomination would be made.




GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

Anti-fraud Policy


Definition of fraud (in respect to the scholarship)
